**Plan Review Fees**

All fees are in addition to the permit fee.

1. For single family and duplex residential units not part of a group development, the plan review fee shall be as follows:
  - a. Up to 2400 square feet of gross floor area - \$75.00
  - b. 2401 - 4800 square feet of gross floor area - \$150.00
  - c. 4801 - unlimited square feet of gross floor area - \$250.00
  - d. When plan review is required for alterations, additions, and/or accessory buildings, the plan review fee shall be \$50.00.
2. For single family and duplex residential units as part of a group development, the plan review fee shall be equal to 50% of the permit fee. When plan review is required for alterations, additions, and/or accessory buildings the plan review fee shall be 50% of the permit fee.
3. Non-residential and multi-family properties, the fee will be 50% of the permit fee to be paid at the time of submission. When plan review is required for alterations, additions, and/or accessory buildings the plan review fee shall be 50% of the permit fee.
4. When projects exceed two resubmissions of revised plans, each submission will be reassessed the plan review fee equal to 50% of the permit fee.

**Building permits valuations.** The applicant for a permit shall provide an estimated permit value at time of application. Permit valuations shall include total value of work, including materials and labor, for which the permit is being issued, such as electrical, gas, mechanical, plumbing equipment and permanent systems. If, in the opinion of the building official, the valuation is underestimated on the application, the permit shall be denied, unless the applicant can show detailed estimates to meet the approval of the building official. Final building permit valuation shall be set by the building official. The BVD (Building Valuation Data) published every 6 months by ICC (International Code Council) shall be used in help determining the construction value.

**Work commencing before permit issuance.** Any person who commences any work on a building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system before obtaining the necessary permits the fees shall be doubled.

**Related fees.** The payment of the fee for the construction, alteration, removal or demolition for work done in connection to or concurrently with the work authorized by a building permit shall not relieve the applicant or holder of the permit from the payment of other fees that are prescribed by law.

**Refunds.** The building official is authorized to issue a building permit refund within 30 days of issuing the permit, provided no work has started on the project. The refund shall be approved by the jurisdictions administrator. A letter requesting the refund must be hand delivered to the jurisdiction within 30 calendar days of the permit issuance date.

**AN ORDINANCE CHANGING ELECTION PROCEDURES TO ELIMINATE WARDS AND PROVIDE FOR ELECTION BY A PLURALITY; SPECIFICALLY TO AMEND CHAPTER 2 ARTICLE II SECTION 2-33 "ELIGIBILITY OF MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS" AND CHAPTER 20 ARTICLE III SECTION 20-65 "DETERMINATION OF RESULTS.**

**FINDINGS:** The City of Liberty, South Carolina (the "City") currently provides for four councilmembers to be qualified by being members of each ward. The City has had times where few or even no ward members have filed for election. Council wants to ensure enough qualified candidates run for office without regards as to which ward they reside; and,

The current ordinance requires a majority vote to obtain office as allowed under South Carolina Code § 5-15-62, sometimes resulting in the additional expense of a runoff election, and the City would save expense by changing to the general election method under South Carolina Code § 5-15-62.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Liberty, South Carolina, in a meeting duly assembled, that Sections 2-33 and 2-65 of The Code of Ordinances of the City of Liberty, South Carolina, is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 2-33. - Eligibility of mayor and councilmembers.**

The mayor shall be a qualified elector of the municipality. ~~Four councilmembers shall be qualified electors of the municipality and ward from which they are elected and two~~ All six councilmembers shall be qualified electors of the municipality from which they are elected without regard to ward.

**Sec. 20-65. - Determination of results.**

~~(a)~~ Election results shall be determined according to the nonpartisan plurality method described in S.C. Code 1976, § 5-15-61 ~~5-15-63~~.

~~(b)~~ A second election shall be conducted two weeks after the first election between one more than the number of candidates necessary to fill offices for which no candidate received a majority of the votes cast, and that election shall be between the candidates receiving the largest number of votes in the first election. The candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast in the second election shall be declared elected.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 35 ARTICLE II SECTION 35-31 "DRINKING IN PUBLIC" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF LIBERTY**

**FINDINGS:** The Mayor and City Council have been approached by certain organizations requesting modification to the Ordinance forbidding drinking in public. Council is aware that certain festivals or events include responsible drinking of alcohol if it is supervised and approved in a reasonable manner, and that it is conducted in a limited area for a limited amount of time.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Liberty, South Carolina, that Section 35-31 of The Code of Ordinances of the City of Liberty, South Carolina, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Indicates New Matter

**Sec. 35-31. - Drinking in public.**

**(A) Open Containers.** It shall be unlawful for any person to drink from or to possess an open container whose contents contain alcohol, any spirituous, malt, vinous, fermented, brewed, or other type of liquor, beer, or wine which contains alcohol, and is used as a beverage, upon any street, highway, park, private or public conveyance, or other public property within the municipality- except to the extent authorized by permits under this section for special events and block parties, and for other public facilities and buildings when a permit is issued under division (B)(5).

**(B) Open or closed container.** It shall be unlawful for any person to be in possession of any container of beer, wine, alcoholic liquor, or any similar intoxicating beverage, or any combination thereof inclusive of mixed drinks, whether opened or unopened, when on the premises of any municipal-owned building, parking lot, lands, open fields, parks or plaza, except that:

(1) No violation of this section shall occur when intoxicating beverages are provided under a state license or permit during a scheduled event at a city-owned venue or property;

(2) No violation of this section shall occur when intoxicating beverages are provided in compliance with a state-issued permit at any hotel, motel, restaurant or other eating establishment leasing space in a city-owned building;

(3) No violation of this section shall occur when a person carries a container of intoxicating beverage directly from one place of lawful possession to another, or to or from a motor vehicle where intoxicating beverage is otherwise lawfully stored, provided the container is enclosed in a bag or carrying case, and provided the person does not stop or linger or attempt to consume the intoxicating beverage while in transit;

(4) No violation of this section shall occur if the container of an intoxicating beverage is in the possession of a law enforcement personnel, prosecutor, defense attorney, trier of fact, trier of law or court personnel when the container is being processed in the chain of evidence in a criminal investigation or criminal proceeding;

(5) No violation of this section shall occur if the possession, service or consumption of intoxicating beverages occurs at a function for which the City Administrator or her designee authorizes the use of a building, parking lot, plaza or park for receptions or similar events and the number of invitees is appropriately limited for the size of the facility which is not open to the public at large, provided that safeguards are in place against public intoxication, service of alcohol to minors, service to persons under the influence of intoxicants, or service to members of the general public who are not participants in the event, and provided the City Administrator or her designee sets time limits for the service of such intoxicating beverages. In administering this provision or any other provision under this code authorizing the possession of intoxicating beverages, the City Administrator or her designee shall have broad discretion to regulate the conditions of service, including the authority to restrict the types of beverages to be served; and

(6) No violation of this section shall occur if the possession, service or consumption of beer and wine is within a designated city-owned public space for city-sponsored event(s). The designated space must be clearly marked. See § 94.09(A)(9) regarding alcoholic beverages at the Liberty Depot building. The city officials shall provide safeguards against public intoxication, service of alcohol to minors, service to persons under the influence of intoxicants, or service to members of the general public who are not participants in the event, and provided the City Administrator or her designee sets time limits for the service of such intoxicating beverages. In administering the provision or any other provision under this code authorizing the possession of intoxicating beverages, the City Administrator or her designee shall have broad discretion to regulate the conditions of service, including the authority to restrict the types of beverages to be served.

(C) No glass bottles, containers or cans may be sold or distributed on the public right-of-way, and no patron may carry a glass bottle, container or can on the public right-of-way during events. It shall be unlawful to sell beverages in glass containers for off-premises consumption at events.

(D) As addressed in Section 11-45 of the city's business license ordinance, should any proprietor, owner or manager of any business firm, excluding those regularly licensed by the state to sell intoxicating liquors, be convicted in Municipal Court, for selling or otherwise handling intoxicating liquors, the business license of such convicted person to do business in the city shall immediately be revoked or suspended by the City Council, and no new license shall be granted to such convicted person during the year on which the revoked license was based.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption.
