## **AN ORDINANCE**

**To amend ARTICLE II: COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL, Sec. 41-31. - Collection of garbage, refuse and bulk items.**

**Whereas**, the City of Liberty has established the use of a sideloading garbage truck and

**Whereas**, the garbage truck requires the use of specific 96 gallon roll carts for the purpose of garbage collection only as defined by the city.

**Whereas** the Liberty City Council believes the cost of the use of these required trash cans should be reasonable for those using the service. The City has adopted policies regarding the allocation and cost for use of the trash cans.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, SOUTH CAROLINA**, to adopt and incorporate the attached rules, regulations, and guidelines governing the allocation and cost of garbage cans in use in the City of Liberty.

First Reading: September 13, 2021

**Section 41-31. - Collection of garbage, refuse and bulk items. Is amended to add parts (d) and (e). Each part will read as follows:**

(d) Each residential address in the city must participate in the City's garbage collection service. Each address will be allocated one 96 Gallon City owned roll cart assigned to each address by serial number. Roll carts will to be used for trash only as approved by the city. Each address has the option to request one additional roll cart if the initial roll cart is not sufficient. No address may use no more than two cans. Garbage is not allowed to be placed outside the can for any reason, or garbage will not be picked up. Roll carts must be placed with handle facing the residence and a minimum of 3 feet from any obstacle.


(e) Each address will be charged \$11.00 per month for the initial roll cart and garbage collection. Should a request be made to city hall a second roll cart is available for \$6.00 per month for the second roll cart and its garbage collection These prices are subject to change at the discretion of the Mayor and Council. by majority vote.
