# AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF A CITY OPERATING BUDGET, ITS EXECUTION AND EFFECT, FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY, SOUTH CAROLINA:

SECTION 1. In accordance with Section 2-48 of The Code of the City of Liberty, South Carolina, there is hereby adopted for the fiscal period July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, an operating budget for the City of Liberty, South Carolina, based on budget estimates of various funds as prepared by the City Administrator and incorporated into the FY 2024-2025 Budget, and as indicated in the attached schedule.

SECTION 2. The total revenues and expenditures for the fiscal period are estimated as follows:

SECTION 4. A copy of the budget containing detailed schedules which support the appropriations set forth in Section 2, above, shall be maintained as an official record in the office of the City Administrator.

SECTION 5. The sums appropriated and set forth in the detailed schedules for personnel services shall be paid in accordance with the current pay plan, or as shown in the budget for those positions not classified under the pay plan.

SECTION 6. All sums received by the City of Liberty from any source whatsoever, unless by law designated for some special fund or purpose, may be used in meeting disbursements from the General Fund, as described in Section 2, above.

SECTION 7. The City Administrator is authorized to inform the County Tax Collector, or such other officer of the County as may be appropriate, to levy such ad valorem millage as will be reasonable and appropriate to raise the ad valorem revenue reflected in the approved budget, provided such millage does not exceed the amount allowed by South Carolina Section 6-1-320 "Millage Rate Increase Limitations; Exceptions".





# Millage Rates 2018 - Proposed Budget




Inside City Limit Trash Pickup Rate 2018 - Proposed Budget



## **Summary:**

It would costs the City approximately \$63,000 more annually to run its own residential trash pick program versus continuing to outsource residential trash pick up to Meridian.

During last night's budget presentation, Daniel asked a question on Other Revenue on Slide 8. The slide shows \$116,219 for Other Revenue for FY 22/23 Actual . For FY 24/25 Budget we are projecting only \$35,300 of Other Revenue.

The \$116,219 Other Revenue from FY 22/23 actual includes \$72,023 from the General Fund's Miscellaneous Revenue account. Unfortunately, I do not have a way to go back to see the details of this in Tyler.

The FY 24/25 budget includes \$12,300 for cell tower rent and \$23,000 for a SCMIT/SCMIRF refund. These total \$35,300.


